



RECORDED INCIDENTS/ CRIMES/OFFENCES:

Update since June 2015, there have been 368 incidents reported to Police Scotland in the Portlethen area which covers the Crathes, Drumoak and Durriss Community Council area.

The majority of calls have related to road traffic issues and anti-social behaviour type calls. Of all the incidents reported, 23 have related to calls in the Crathes, Drumoak and Durriss area. This resulted in 4 crime reports being raised, which included the theft of a motorbike from an insecure shed. ***Residents are again reminded to keep outbuildings secure and cover any windows if possible.***

OTHER WORK:

High visibility mobile patrols will continue to be carried out throughout the Kincardine and Mearns beat area, whenever possible, to reduce the likelihood of crimes and offences occurring.

Summer Drink Drive Campaign

The Scottish Government and Road Safety Scotland (part of Transport Scotland) launched their 2015 Summer Drink Drive Campaign in support of Police Scotland's Summer Safety Campaign in June. In Scotland, a driver was stopped and breath tested every two minutes.

New data shows that in Scotland there has been a 17% reduction in drink driving offences from January - March 2015 compared to the same period in 2014.

Using the strapline "Don't Spoil Summer", the campaign reminded drivers that getting behind the wheel after even one drink isn't worth the risk or the consequences.
