



A93 Crathes Street Lighting, Pedestrian Refuge and Footpath Widening

Aberdeenshire Council has informed us that work is set to commence on Monday 10th June which will involve the temporary re-location of the bus stops and traffic control at the A93 junction with the A957 (Slug Road)

Aberdeenshire Council Roads Service are planning to carry out street lighting works, footpath widening and the construction of a new pedestrian refuge at A93 Crathes. These works are set to commence on Monday, 10th June for 8-10 Weeks. As a result, the BUS STOPS will need to be temporarily relocated further east from the A957 Junction. See below.

The council understands that this may cause inconvenience, and they ask that we be assured that every effort will be made to minimise disruptions to residents and businesses. They advise that relocation of the bus stop is essential for public safety and the well-being of their workforce on site.

Pedestrian access to Crathes Hall will be maintained, and we are asked to wait to be escorted through the site by an operative.

The council request our understanding and cooperation during this time, as ensuring pedestrian safety post-completion is their utmost priority.

These works will make significant improvements to overall safety for those that use the paths and buses on the A93 in Crathes. The path widening will put some very welcome distance between pedestrians and the traffic and the additional lighting should increase safety in the winter.
